





GPA Calculations

Early Release/Late Arrivals

Any student requesting must submit an application form at time of advising **Juniors- allowed 1** (not guaranteed) **Seniors- allowed 3** (not guaranteed)

- Application form submitted with note from parent/guardian
- Early Release/Late Arrival periods need to be requested <u>now- not next</u> <u>year!</u>
- Credits MUST be in good standing
- EOC/STAAR exams passed
- College, Career and Military Ready (CCMR) complete or in progress

• Students are unable to drop a Practicum or CTE Course for ER/LA • Student MUST provide own transportation • Student MUST NOT be on campus during a release period • Failing a class for any 6 weeks period may result in loss of an Early Release/Late Arrival period

What is CCMR? (College, Career, and Military Readiness)

College Career and Military Readiness (CCMR) in Texas prepares high school students for college, careers, and military service. It emphasizes rigorous coursework, career exploration through programs of study and internships, and military readiness with fitness training and leadership development. Collaborating with schools, employers, and communities, CCMR ensures students have the skills and resources for success. Whether pursuing higher education, entering the workforce, or considering military service, CCMR equips students with the tools they need to thrive after graduation.

***Graduates must be CCMR Met before the end of their 12th grade year.

COLLEGE READY

Texas Education Agency considers a student College Ready when they meet any one of the following criteria:

- Qualifying scores on the SAT, ACT, or TSIA test
- Receive a 3 or higher on at least one Advanced Placement (AP) exam
- Successfully complete an OnRamps Course
- Earn 3 hours in Dual Credit English/Math or 9 hours in other Dual Credit courses
- Earn an Associates Degree

CAREER READY

Career Ready indicators set by the Texas Education Agency include meeting any one of the following criteria:

- Earn an Industry-Based Certification
- Complete a Program of Study in CTE
- Graduate with a completed IEP and workforce readiness
- Earn an Level I or Level II certificate

MILITARY READY

Per the Texas Education Agency, a student is Military Ready if they enlist in a branch of the Armed Forces and score a qualifying score on the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) Test.

What is the Hawk Scholars Academy Program?



Hawk Scholars Academy is a group of selected students who participate in extensive dual credit coursework beginning their freshman year of high school with the goal of completing the 42-semester credit hour core curriculum as established by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board for all undergraduate students in Texas public higher education institutions. Student also have the opportunity to complete their associates degree. Hawk Scholars Academy graduates will be recognized at graduation.

With your parents at home:

- 1. Review the Course selection presentation 2. Review Couse Selection Sheet for your grade level and pick your courses
- 3. Add the courses to the "Parent/Guardian & Me Form"

At School with your counselor: (First week in February) 1. Counselors will visit your classes the first week in February & assist with completing a hard copy of your course selection form. Afterwards, counselors will input your selections into Skyward.






